Deep Water Terminal welcomes Pelagic vessels

The multifunctional Deep Water Terminal (DWT) demonstrated its capabilities with the arrival of Pelagic vessels, this month.



Pelagic vessels have a deep draft, these vessels require significant water depth-something that few ports on Scotland's west coast can provide. Pelagic trawling is a key fishing method, towing large nets to catch midwater species such as herring, mackerel, and blue whiting.

The Stornoway DWT continues to prove its value as a hub for maritime activity, and the arrival of Pelagic vessels marks another significant step in its growing role within the region.

Luggage van

The introduction of a luggage van for passengers on the Stornoway to Ullapool ferry service has significantly improved operations, helping to ease some of the challenges caused by the Passenger Access System being out of use.

Stornoway Port Authority is in discussions with its insurance company to determine the next steps for the system's resolution. In the meantime, the luggage van has been well received by travellers and has proven successful.



CalMac Ferries, Ullapool Harbour, and Stornoway Port Authority continue to work closely to ensure the luggage service is as efficient as possible, with CalMac staff on hand to assist passengers and provide support when requested.

While foot passengers may experience slight disembarkation delays, vehicle passengers remain unaffected, and efforts are ongoing to minimise disruption.


The wall towards the RNLI building is being extended. It had been previously left until some cable diversions were undertaken but this has now been completed.
